**Article 1** The regulations is enacted in accordance with “ National Chengchi University College of Science Regulations For Graduate Student Scholarship and Bursaries ”.

**Article 2** The College of Science (hereinafter referred to as "the College") establishes a Graduate Scholarship Review Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") to oversee scholarship review matters. The Committee comprises the Dean and the heads of all departments and institutes as ex officio members, along with one elected member from among the full-time faculty of each department or institute. The Dean serves as the convener. Committee members serve a one-year term and may be re-elected consecutively.

**Article 3** The graduate scholarships offered by the College are categorized into two types: (1) Academic Paper Award and (2) Academic Excellence Award. A student may receive both types of scholarships in the same semester. For the Academic Paper Award, graduate students of the College may apply if they have published a paper within the specified timeframe that has not previously received the Academic Paper Award from the College. Applications for the Academic Paper Award can be submitted once per semester, with deadlines on March 31 and September 30, respectively. Only papers published within one year prior to the application deadline are eligible, and all application materials must be submitted by the announced deadline (inclusive). If the paper submitted for the Academic Paper Award has multiple authors, all co-authors who wish to apply must submit a joint application. The scholarship funds will be allocated among the eligible co-authors enrolled in the College, based on their contributions, as determined by the Scholarship Review Committee. The review results and award recipient list must be compiled and submitted to the university for approval within two months after the start of each semester.

**Article 4** The award review committee shall review academic paper awards based on the following reward standards:

1. Papers published in journals indexed in SCI(E), SSCI, EI, or TSSCI: NT\$12,000 per paper.
2. Papers published in journals indexed in MR (Mathematical Reviews) or CIS (Current Index to Statistics): NT\$10,000 per paper.
3. Papers published in proceedings of international conferences indexed in SCI(E) or EI: NT\$6,000 per paper.
4. Papers presented at international conferences with an anonymous review system or published in domestic and international journals with external reviews (excluding the journals listed in the first and second categories): NT\$4,000 per paper.
5. Papers presented at domestic conferences with an anonymous review system: NT\$2,000 per paper.
6. Papers with other outstanding achievements will be discussed separately for awards.

For papers published in journals, submission for award can be made once the paper is indexed (including accepted papers). For conference papers, submission is only accepted for those that have already been presented.

Before applying for the paper reward from the College, applicants must first apply for funding or awards from the university's R&D Office. If the funding exceeds the College's subsidy standards, no further application for the same paper can be made to the College; if the funding is lower than the College's subsidy standards, the difference will be supplemented based on the actual funding from the university's R&D Office.

**Article 5** The number of recipients and the amount for the Excellent Academic Performance Award each semester will be determined by each department, with a principle of awarding no more than NT\$15,000 and no less than NT\$5,000 per recipient. The total amount for each department's excellent performance awards will be allocated based on the department's proportion of total graduate students, after deducting the academic paper awards from the college's allocated budget.

1. Publication of academic works and participation in academic conferences.
2. Academic performance (new students' scores will be based on entrance exam results).
3. Participation in department affairs and other special contributions.

The initial review results should be submitted to the College's award review committee for further review within one and a half months after the start of each semester.

**Article 6** Applicants for graduate student scholarships are limited to graduate students of the College, excluding in-service master's students, students on leave, and exchange students.

Graduate student scholarships can be applied for once each semester, and applicants must submit their applications within the designated timeframe.

**Article 7** The College may retain 5% of the graduate student subsidy fund to assist with research, teaching, and administrative tasks. The remaining funds will be distributed to departments and institutes based on the ratio of the total number of

master's and doctoral students.

When a department or institute organizes a national or international academic event, they may apply to the College for graduate student work-study funding. The amount of the subsidy will be determined by the dean based on the event's budget.

**Article 8** The awarding of scholarships for in-service graduate students will be handled according to the school's regulations.

**Article 9** Graduate student subsidies may be used to pay the learning allowances for part-time learning assistants or wages for part-time labor assistants. Graduate students may receive both types of support. Each college or department/institute should establish their own rules for usage within the allocated budget.

The College must allocate at least 10% of the graduate student subsidy fund for financial aid to low-income students.

For the purposes of this article, low-income students include those with proof of being from a low-income household, proof of being from a middle-low-income household, proof of being recognized as low-income by a village or town head, proof of student loans, or those with specific circumstances demonstrating financial need.

**Article 10** Graduate student subsidies must be provided in accordance with the regulations outlined in the "National Chengchi University Student Part-time Assistant and Temporary Personnel Utilization Announcement."

**Article 11** Applicants for graduate student subsidies must be graduate students of the College, excluding in-service graduate students, students on leave, and exchange students. Applicants should submit their applications to the respective department/institute within the designated timeframe.

**Article 12** Graduate students receiving subsidies may also receive scholarships, but they are not allowed to engage in full-time employment during the period they are receiving subsidies. Violations of this rule will result in disqualification, and any subsidies already received must be fully refunded.

**Article 13** These regulations shall take effect upon approval by the College's administrative meeting, and the same applies to any amendments.
